



SORRY ABOUT YOUR DAUGHTER

BIOGRAPHY

Washington, D.C.'s **Sorry About Your Daughter** came out of the early-'90s alternative/post-hardcore scene with sharp hooks, emotional weight, melodic tension, and raw guitar force. Formed in 1992, SAYD built its following before algorithms—through U.S. and European touring, word of mouth, and a live show that turned melody into impact without sanding off the edges.

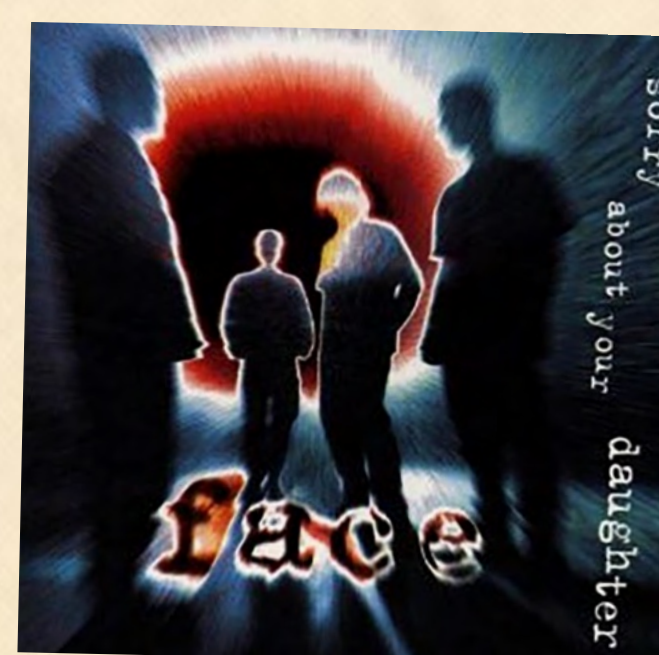
The band released two albums: **Aquarium Center** (1994) and **Face** (1996). *Face*, issued by Marlboro Music/Edel, was recorded at Inner Ear Studios with Don Zientara (Fugazi, Bad Brains) and produced by Oingo Boingo bassist John Avila. The result placed SAYD firmly in D.C.'s lineage of smart, volatile guitar music: Jawbox, Shudder to Think.

"Scapegoat" and "You Gave Up" earned MTV Europe and VIVA rotation. The band shared stages with Joan Jett, Scorpions, Alice Cooper, Ice-T & Body Count, Goldfinger, Cro-Mags, 311, and others—an unusually broad history that matches its mix of melody, abrasion, and precision. Members have also done time in **The Obsessed** and **Government Issue**, plus **Polkadot Cadaver** and **Dog Fashion Disco**.

Now **SAYD** returns from an eight-show European run for the final date of the Atlantic to Adrenaline Tour. On Aug. 28, the band comes to Columbia 30 years after *Face*—and after the last hometown-area show sold out. This is not nostalgia. The songs still carry hooks, tension, volume, and the emotional weight that earned SAYD its cult following in the first place.
